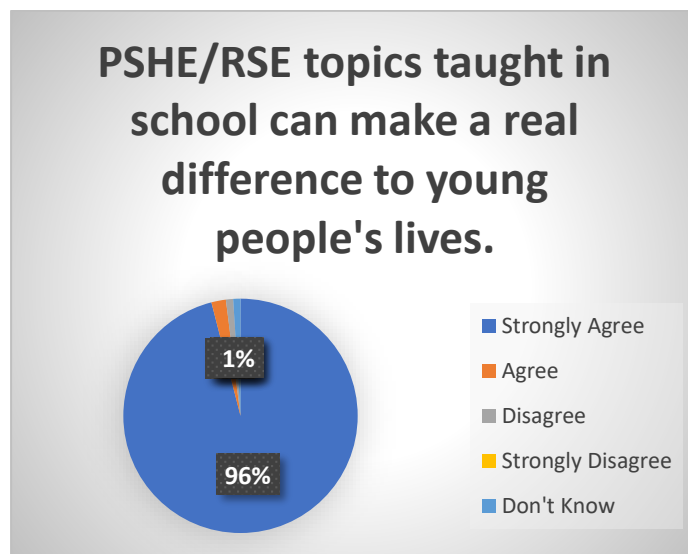
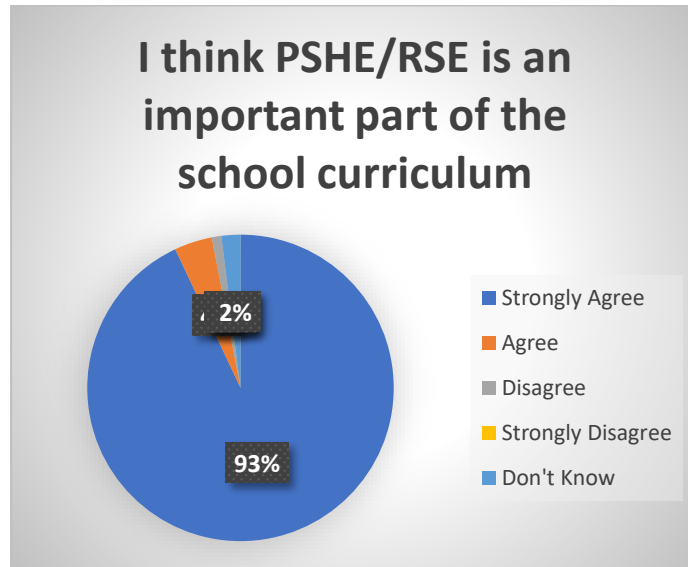
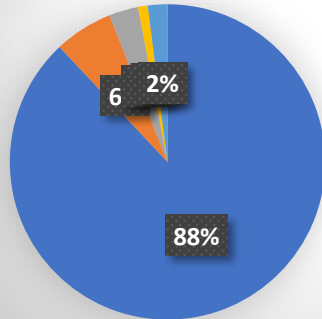


Parental/Carer Consultation Results Analysis

Birchwood Junior School received 124 parental/carers responses.

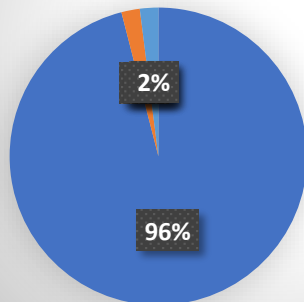


I feel happy talking to my child about growing up, sex and relationships.



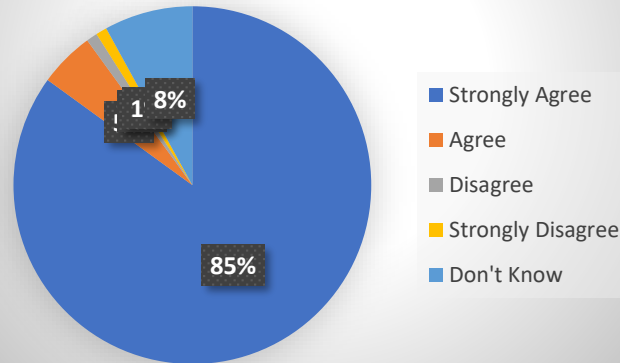

From Summer Term 2021, it is mandatory that all schools offer an up to date and contextualised PSHE/RSE curriculum. This is so we can support the children by being proactive rather than reactive.
